



Misconception #1: RRFBs Require Immediate Changes

The Concern

Some might assume that the formal addition of RRFBs to the 2024 MUTCD requires immediate changes to existing products.

The Reality

RRFBs have been specified as the preferred product for pedestrian safety for years and have now been formally added to the MUTCD under **Chapter 4L**. TraffiCalm's RRFBs already comply with these standards, meaning no immediate changes are necessary.

What This Means for You

Continue using TraffiCalm RRFBs confidently, as they meet all current MUTCD requirements without needing modifications.

Misconception #2 - LED Sign Rings Must Be Removed Due to Clustering Rules

The Concern

New rules on LED clustering suggest that existing LED sign rings must be immediately removed or replaced.

The Reality

The 2024 MUTCD prohibits clustering of LEDs on signboards, as detailed in **Section 2A.12**. TraffiCalm's current LED Rings are under redesign to comply with these new standards. During this transition, products will be "grandfathered in," ensuring continued funding eligibility.

What This Means for You

You can continue to use existing LED sign rings while we finalize the updated designs that meet the new requirements.

Misconception #3 - Flashing Sign Rings Need Immediate Replacement

The Concern

The requirement to replace flashing sign rings with beacons means all existing installations must be immediately swapped out.

The Reality

Section 4S.03 of the 2024 MUTCD specifies that signs with "WHEN FLASHING" in their legend must transition to beacons. TraffiCalm is actively replacing flashing sign rings with compliant beacons, ensuring a smooth transition without immediate disruption.

What This Means for You

Plan for a phased transition to compliant beacons, using the two-year adoption window provided by the MUTCD.

Misconception #4 - Vehicle Speed Feedback Signs Can Use Flashing Elements

The Concern

Some believe Vehicle Speed Feedback Signs (VSFs) can still use flashing, strobing, or changing colors as part of their display.

The Reality

Section 2C.13 clearly states that VSFs cannot incorporate flashing, strobing, or colorchanging elements. TraffiCalm's new VFS products are designed to meet these specifications, ensuring compliance without compromising on effectiveness.

What This Means for You

Ensure that any new VSF installations align with these requirements, avoiding non-compliant features that could lead to issues down the line.

This is especially common in states like **Minnesota** (due to weather considerations) and **Texas** (with heavily modified state-specific guidelines).

What This Means for You: Be sure to check your state's MUTCD to ensure full compliance. Even if you meet the federal standard, local rules may require additional adjustments.

2024 MUTCD State Specific MUTCD Guidelines **Q: Will the new LED rings and VFS be ready before the deadline? A:** Yes, they'll be available well before 2026.

Q: How do I check state-specific guidelines?

Q: Are current LED rings still eligible for funding?A: Yes, existing LED rings are grandfathered in and remain eligible until the new versions are available.
